



# Scam Artists & The Games They Play



Scam artists are getting tricky. Just last month, a hard-working woman from Evans told investigators that she had been conned out of \$20,000 by someone she met on an online dating service.

The woman is not rich. In fact, she works hard for every dollar she earns by stocking shelves at the Evans Walmart.

But this online guy (who called himself "Michael") told her his mother was sick and he needed money to get her back to the United States for treatment.

**Feeling sorry for him**, the hard-working Walmart associate took out a cash advance on her credit card for \$20,000. She told cops that she received a check from "Michael" for \$20,000, so she thought she was covered.

As instructed, the woman then sent five money grams totaling \$20,000 to three subjects in Ghana, Africa.

Two weeks later, the victim's bank called her and said the check she had received from "Michael" and deposited to cover the money grams was no good and they were not going to refund her account.

It's unfortunate, but there is little that investigators in Columbia County can do in such cases.

But I can't fault the woman for being sympathetic and overly trusting. I came close to being a victim myself in February.

A letter arrived in the mail for my wife Sherron. She lets me handle all mail, so I opened it.

**Immediately, a check for \$1,996** plopped out. The letter, from "American Consumer Opinion" congratulated my wife for being selected to participate in a Consumer Research Program. The letter said the check was to assist in the assignment and that my wife could keep \$250, plus all the items she purchased from Walmart and JC Penney as part of a "service evaluation." Most of the check was to pay for the \$1,500 to be transferred to Western Union as part of a "survey" of their services.



What they wanted my wife to do was deposit their check in our account and wire them \$1,500 of our money. By the time the bank discovered the check was bogus, they would be long gone with our real money.

Since this sounded way too easy, I went online and entered their company name and "scam" in the subject line.


Sure enough, there are other victims being conned by someone who is ripping off the good name of the real American Consumer Opinion.

**Their are two lessons:** If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

And it doesn't hurt to do your homework before you let a dime of your money leave your hands.


He was charged with DUI and his license was suspended, the report stated.





The officer checked her car and then asked to look in her purse. Massey handed it over, but first she pulled out a brown cap that appeared to have something concealed in it.


The officer looked in the purse and then asked to look in the cap.

During a recent search of the Wrightsboro Road business, officers found 19 small bags of powder coke on owner Freeman Jordan, according to a sheriff's report.

In his pickup truck, they allegedly found 5 grams of pot in the center console and a Ma-


son jar in the back with 7 grams of marijuana.

Jordan, 33, of Hephzibah, is charged with possession of marijuana and cocaine with intent to distribute, the report stated.









# Bank Robber Caught After Stopping for Beer

A bank robber was foiled last Wednesday afternoon when he stopped to buy beer in Aiken just minutes after the holdup, authorities said.

At about 2:45 pm, Security Federal Bank on Richland Avenue was robbed by Marvin Thomas Mims of Augusta, authorities said. Mims presented a note, was given funds, and fled on foot to a nearby parking lot where he had parked a blue Ford Ranger pickup truck.

Aiken Public Safety officers were initially responding to an alarm at the bank

shortly after the robbery occurred.

Mims was observed by an alert citizen who contacted police and provided detailed information. Mims briefly entered the Food Lion grocery store in Kalmia Plaza to buy beer and then left the parking lot in the truck.

He was arrested on Richland Avenue a short distance from the bank. Funds taken during the robbery were recovered.

No injuries were reported.

Mims was charged with bank robbery.

The caller made another 911 call and claimed she was near


Sav-A-Lot in the wooded area. Officers again couldn't find her. A third 911 call from the same number gave a third location.

An officer first stopped him just after noon and he was given a verbal warning and told how to get a permit to legally solicit in the city,


But the North Augusta Department of Public Safety was called again at about 2 p.m. and Parker was given a written warning.

When the officer saw him again, just after 5 p.m., he was finally arrested, taken to jail and charged with soliciting without a permit, according to reports.

In a similar case in Columbia County, deputies responded to complaints of people selling items door to door last Wednesday in the Rhodes Hill subdivision of Martinez.

Officers found a van carrying 17 people with some saying they worked for sales company Offbeat Services from New Jersey. Five of them had criminal records.




DFCS officials took custody of the girl. Weaving was charged with child cruelty and both parents were charged with deprivation of a minor.

He fell for it and then he realized it was just a bunch of cut-up papers. He was out about 200 in merchandise. Sorry to say he is very young and this was a lesson learned.

The guy actually showed him money but done a switch on him.

## From Chris:

I was scammed not to long ago. I trusted these people.

They pawned the title on a car and told me that I could get it for \$50 a week and the deal was me pay \$900



and they would pay the rest. I didn't get any receipts or sign no paperwork.

Well it didn't work that way. I paid \$800 and gave them my old car for \$100 off the payment. The car ended up getting repossessed because they never paid their part.

So I'm out of \$800 and a car because I don't have proof that I paid that or anything. People can be real scumbags, but it teaches us a lesson I guess.

## From Kimberli:

Yes, I hate to admit it but I have fallen victim to a scam: I received in my mailbox one day what looked like a perfectly legitimate check for \$3,000. Well, I proceeded to my regular bank to try to deposit it, they told me it looked suspicious to them, so I took it to another bank they went ahead and deposited the check, but told me that there would be a hold put on the funds until the bank checked it out.

Days went by, I did some research on it and found out that it was a rubber check.

## From Eileen:

I had someone try to scam me with the fake check stuff..I had motorcycle for sale on Craigslist and wanted \$4,500, they sent me check for \$8,000 and told me to Western Union them the difference.

They'd send for the bike sight unseen. Let's just say my bike is still where it ought to be and the check is not in my bank as they thought it was.

## From Robert:

I got taken by about \$1,500 from this person but she ripped off a lot of others by \$30K each, so I consider myself lucky.

She was finally arrested by the FBI and now has blogs and a Facebook page (by me) set up in her "honor".

ize the home of your family or neighbor. I hope you would think, not once, not twice, three times, if you have to, about the consequences of your behavior.


All of the faces that you see in this week's JAIL REPORT, if found guilty, will not be able to take back the consequence of their actions. Misdemeanor convictions are crimes. Felonies convictions are certainly crimes.

**IF YOU ARE EVER FACED** with a decision whether you should or you shouldn't do something of a criminal nature, I would strongly suggest you choose not to do it because criminal background checks are becoming the norm for employers BEFORE you are offered a job or even given the opportunity to step foot on the premises as an employee.

Employers won't care that you've turned your life around. Employers won't care that the misdemeanor or felony conviction were a one-time mistake. Employers won't even care that you now sit on the front pew at church or sing melodiously in the choir on Sundays—once you taint your good reputation, it's hard to get it back.

That's why you have to be mindful of the things that you do today and how they will impact your tomorrow. With that said, I encourage you to think before you get arrested for a senseless and unnecessary crime. Because in the eyesight of a potential employer, there is no difference between misdemeanor and felony convictions and it's your reputation that you're putting at stake and no one can protect your reputation better than you.

# Weird, Wild & Wacky Arrests

## ACCUSED PIG KILLER WAS ANGRY OVER BAD BREAK-UP



A Virginia woman accused of beheading a pig was arrested again last month, charged with stealing fire extinguishers and a cross from a nearby church.

Ashley Marie Fowler, 21, of Portsmouth, became a suspect in the church theft after police searched her SUV for evidence in the pig-beheading case. One of the pigs' owners told investigators that Fowler murdered the animals in retaliation because he broke up with a woman who is Fowler's friend.

Investigators searching the woman's 1996 Ford Explorer discovered six fire extinguishers and a large wooden cross. Another search warrant filed in connection with the pig-beheading case reported that an ax, a Bowie knife with black sheath, a camouflage boot, a black ski cap and gloves also were found in the SUV.

The investigation began when a Chesapeake family found a piglet's head on their front porch and another one stabbed in a barn. A woman told police it all started as an idea for a prank after she told a co-worker about breaking up with the piglets' owner, Zach Sawyer.

On Feb. 6, two days before the piglets were hurt, Sawyer's ex-girlfriend told Fowler that Sawyer had broken up with her. The ex-girlfriend and Fowler had worked together for a year at The Home Depot on Hillcrest Parkway, in Hickory, authorities said.

Fowler told the ex-girlfriend that she and an unidentified man went to Sawyer's house, killed the pigs and slashed the tires of Sawyer's truck, a police statement said. Fowler is charged with two counts of felony killing/maiming livestock, vandalism and felony possession of Adderall. Fowler also is accused of slashing the tires on Sawyer's pickup.

## WOMAN DELIVERS BEAT-DOWN OVER GIRL SCOUT COOKIES



A 31-year-old Florida woman was arrested last month following a dispute with her roommate over Girl Scout cookies.

The fight was over an empty box of Thin Mints, or chocolate covered mint cookies that are sold by the Girl Scouts. Suspect Hersha Howard literally went nuts after she discovered that her box of thin mints had been stolen and eaten, police say.

Apparently, her roommate fed the cookies to the Howard's children because they woke up hungry and couldn't sleep. The roommate immediately apologized and even offered to reimburse her for the cookies.

Howard refused, and the two women began to argue. Then Howard picked up a pair of scissors and followed the roommate in a

threatening manner, police say. Howard dropped the scissors and picked up a board and struck her as she ran down the stairs. The woman then ran to the kitchen, where Howard followed her, knocked her to the ground and continued to hit her.

The husband separated them, allowing the woman to run out of the house. Howard followed and picked up a sign and began to strike the woman again, police say.

When police arrived to the scene of the incident they arrested Howard, and she was charged with aggravated battery with a deadly weapon and aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

## Girlfriend's Google Search Sends Man Into Rage



A 20-year-old South Dakota man was jailed last month after he tied up and beat his girlfriend after he discovered that she had Googled "How to get out of an abusive relationship."

According to police, Jose Sanchez became enraged when he discovered that his 18-year-old girlfriend had used her cell phone to research "how to get out of an abusive relationship."

Investigators say the victim tried to delete the search phrase from her phone, but things turned ugly when Sanchez checked the phone's deleted history and discovered what she had been researching.

Police say Sanchez retaliated by tying the victim up with a belt and an extension cord. He then allegedly punched and kicked her for 20 minutes

until she convinced him that she needed to go to a hospital.

Sanchez reportedly took the woman to the hospital and stood by while she told emergency workers that she had been in a fight with another woman. She was treated for multiple cracked ribs and bruising before being released.

The victim finally had an opportunity to escape when Sanchez became intoxicated and went to another apartment in the complex to see a friend. That's when she called police and told them what had happened.

Sanchez was booked into jail on charges of aggravated assault, second-degree kidnapping and interfering with emergency communications.

## YOGI BEAR ARRESTED IN UTAH: SMARTER THAN THE AVERAGE PERP



Long suspected of snatching picnic baskets, the law finally caught up with Yogi Bear last month when he was busted by the Utah County Sheriff's Office!

He faces numerous counts including immigration enforcement charges and fishing without a license!

Yogi, who is described as being 60 years old, 5'8", and weighing 490 lbs, was released later that day after posting bond. We assume he returned to

his listed address in Provo, Utah.

Yogi booked out of jail after paying a hefty \$137,975 total bail (\$100,000 for the rooting charge, \$12,345 for fishing without a license, and \$25,630 for wrongful appropriation.)

Investigators stated that Yogi was not actually arrested, and that his mugshot was part of a test on the website for the Utah County Sheriff's Office Corrections Bureau.

## Girlfriend Kills Man Who Dared Her To Shoot



When his girlfriend grabbed an antique gun during an argument last month, police say Rodney Lee Gilbert told her to go ahead and fire.

According to Florida authorities, that's exactly what Kimberly Gustafson did. Now, Gilbert is dead, and Gustafson is behind bars.

Police were called to the couple's home on Feb. 17 and found that the 57-year-old victim had been shot in the face. He was taken to an area hospital, where he died from his injuries.

Police said they spoke to witnesses, who said Gilbert had been fighting with Gustafson over her drinking. During the argument, witnesses said Gustafson, 50, went into a bedroom,

returning with an antique firearm.

When she cocked it, witnesses in the house, including Gilbert's ex-wife, pleaded for Gustafson not to shoot. Gustafson walked away back toward the bedroom.

But just as the confrontation was cooling, police say Gilbert stood up and told his girlfriend to "go ahead and shoot me." Witnesses told police that Gilbert followed Gustafson into the hallway, telling her repeatedly to fire.

That's when police say Gustafson turned and fired, striking Gilbert in the face at point-blank range. She fled in her car and was later found nearby.

## Boy Arrested for Stick Figure Drawing



Police in Colorado arrested, fingerprinted and handcuffed an 11-year-old boy based on a stick-figure drawing he made in school.

Last month, his parents complained the October arrest have cost them thousands and led to the boy being put on probation. The boy, identified as "Tim" because the family did not want their names used, has Attention Deficit Disorder and was instructed by his therapist to draw pictures when he feels himself get upset.

In October, he drew a picture of himself as a stick figure, using a gun to shoot several other stick figure people. Above the figures he wrote, "teachers must die" and "music sucks."

Finished with the drawing, the boy was about to throw it out, when it was seen by his teacher. He was sent to the principal's office and Arvada police arrested him at home that night after the school reported the drawing.

The boy's mother said police refused to let her go with her son, who was put into handcuffs and taken to the station. Once there, the boy was allegedly fingerprinted, photographed and put into a cell.

A police report says "Tim" insisted he would never hurt anyone, especially a teacher. He was charged with interfering with staff and students at an educational facility, a third degree misdemeanor.





# A Juvenile Law That Needs to Change



## ATTORNEY'S CORNER

Juvenile courts were created as an alternative to the criminal courts for accused children under 17 years of age.

The procedures and laws which govern the juvenile process are there to provide certain protections for the child. One such protection is the limitations on formally interviewing a juvenile suspect without notifying the juvenile court and the child's parent or guardian. This rule is in place to provide the juvenile with some counsel as to the decision to openly speak to the police where he is the direct target of an investigating.

Recently, while reviewing a trial transcript for a possible appeal, I noticed that the procedure was not followed. Although I was aware that certain exceptions existed to the general notification rule, I was shocked to learn that if the crime was severe

enough, law enforcement does not have to notify anyone before an interview takes place. They are free to treat the accused as an adult.

The reason this revelation should be shocking to anyone who takes a second to ponder it, is that the whole rationale for the creation of the juvenile court and separate procedures is that a juvenile who is accused of a crime is markedly different than an adult offender.

Most adults are, or should be, savvy enough to handle their own decision as to what is in their best interest. Conversely, we do not trust a juvenile to enter into contracts, join the military, or purchase alcoholic beverages. In those situations parental consent cannot override the juvenile's desire to engage in that conduct.


But let a juvenile be charged with murder, child

molestation, armed robbery or other serious felony and all the original protections which should operate to protect a child are no longer present. The child is a sitting target for a trained investigator to use all available tactics to obtain a confession without any consideration of whether the child really understands what is in his best interests.

It just seems to me that the more severe the crime, the more the system should proceed with caution when dealing with an accused child. If that should not be the rule, then why have any protections at all.


Jeannie Mellick was going to her car at about 7:45 p.m. on Feb. 19 when a man appeared, pushed her against her car and yelled at her "I want you money."

Mellick began screaming and the man ran without getting anything. Mellick jumped in her car and left and called the sheriff's office, a report stated.



McGahee was arrested on a charge of battery, according to the report.





Sex charges have been filed in Edgefield and Columbia counties against three men accused of abusing two girls over several years, accusations that surfaced when the Martinez teens stepped forward last year.

A 17-year-old Martinez girl reported on Dec. 26 that she had been raped by Ronnie Lamb (right mugshot) starting when she was 8 years old, according to Columbia County Sheriff's Capt. Steve Morris. She told authorities it started by her touching him and progressed to her performing oral sex on him.

"She said he started having sex with her when she was 13 years old. The last time he had sex with her was August 7, 2010," Morris said in a press release. "She stated he told her if she told anyone that he would kill her and her family."

The girl said Lamb let two males named Marcus James (left mugshot) and "Wally" have sex with her. She said as she would perform oral sex, the other males would hit her in the head, Morris said.

The second victim, now 18 years old from Martinez, told authorities on Dec. 26 that she also was raped by Lamb starting when she was 9 years old. She said when she turned 13, he started having sex with her. He would also involve the same

two males when she turned 14. She told investigators that the last time he had sex with her was August 7, 2010.


"He told her he would kill her and her family if she told anyone," Morris said.

August 7, 2010 was the last time both victims had contact with Lamb. Lamb and James were arrested and charged with aggravated child molestation and both are in custody with no bond. James is in the Columbia County Jail and Lamb is in Edgefield County Jail charged with molesting the victims in their jurisdiction. Edgefield has not charged James but Columbia County has charged both James and Lamb.


Marcus James was arrested last Wednesday and is being held at the Columbia County Jail without bond. Lamb remains in custody at the Edgefield County Detention Center without bond.

Wallace Percival (middle) was arrested in February in Edgefield County in connection to the molestations. Percival was released on a \$20,000 personal recognizance bond after his arrest. He has not been charged by Columbia County.


JOHNSTON – A Strom Thurmond student was arrested after reportedly smoking a marijuana cigarette while performing a community service with other students as part of a class project.

Harkins, 28, of Aiken, was charged with two counts of larceny and one count of deposit account fraud, a report stated.





In addition, burglary warrants were issued for three men who were initially detained in Jefferson County:


